Vocational Scholarship Program

- Over 109 Chapters

Scholarship Application Guidelines

Submit your application to a local chapter. Each chapter may submit up to three (3) vocational scholarship application packets to its designated Frontier Scholarship Representative by the stated deadline.

- Submitted applications may qualify to compete at the Chapter, Frontier, and National levels.
- The Frontier winner will advance to an interview process conducted by the National Scholarship Committee.

Selected Frontier vocational scholarship winners will be interviewed and vetted by the National Scholarship Committee. Final vetting will determine the recipient of the NABSTMC™ Vocational Scholarship Award. Scholarship funds will be mailed directly to the attending institution upon verification of enrollment and attendance in Spring 2026. If selected as the NABSTMC™ National Vocational Scholarship Program winner, you must be available to receive your award at the NABSTMC™ national convention in Tampa, Florida during the weekend of July 9 through 11, 2026.

Local chapters may choose to award scholarship funds **either directly to the student or to the school**, based on chapter discretion. This distinction is separate from Frontier and National-level awards, which are **mailed directly to the student's school** following enrollment verification.

Requirements:

- ☐ Applicant is a graduating high school senior or GED recipient (Fall 2025 - Summer 2026), planning to attend a vocational or trade school.
- ☐ Completed application. Exclude the general info/instructions pages.
- ☐ Unofficial high school transcript, homeschool transcript, or GED transcript. Minimum scores: 2.0 GPA or PASS
- ☐ A one-page maximum letter of recommendation from:
 - ☐ A Teacher, guidance counselor, school administrator, employer, mentor, or other adult familiar with your interests, work, art, or community service accomplishments. **The letter should come from someone who is not an immediate or extended family member.**
- ☐ Letter of acceptance to a vocational or trade School.
- ☐ Signed release form with parent's signature if under 18.
- ☐ A 4-minute minimum to 7-minute maximum **unlisted YouTube video link**. See the guidelines below for more information.
- ☐ Your full name, vocational or trade school student ID number (if available), and the address of the vocational or trade school business office.
- ☐ Photo Submission. This photo will be used for official purposes. Ensure the image is clear, well-lit, and appropriately framed in a neutral background. Please ensure your photo meets the following requirements:
 - ☐ Attire: Business casual OR representing your vocation/trade.
 - ☐ Size: Standard thumbnail dimensions - 1280 x 720 pixels
 - ☐ Format: Photo must be embedded directly into the PDF application.

Video Instructions:

Important: Do not talk about the NABSTMCTM in your video. In your 4–7-minute video include:

- ☐ Introduce yourself
- ☐ Your family background
- ☐ How you give back to your community
- ☐ Your proudest accomplishments to date
- ☐ Certificate, license, or training you are working toward and why you chose it.
- ☐ How NABSTMCTM vocational scholarship funds will help.
- ☐ Answer the question:

What lesson(s) from the history of the Buffalo Soldiers can you apply to your vocational journey?

- ☐ Optional: If you already have experience in your chosen field, show or describe the skills you've learned.
